As Music Director of the Windsor Symphony Orchestra, the University of North Carolina School of the Arts Symphony Orchestra, Artistic Director of the Boise Baroque Orchestra and as the former Associate Conductor of the Houston Symphony, he has achieved success through his focus on each of these values.

Franz just concluded his **fourteen-year tenure as Associate Conductor of the <u>Houston Symphony</u> where he was recently honored with the Raphael Fliegel Award for Visionary Leadership. It was presented to him in recognition of his immense success in advancing the organization's education and community engagement activities.**

The focus of this workshop is the creation, preparation, and live presentation of education programs.
